
Welfare Policy Statement

The company known as AMP Contractors Ltd (AMP) recognizes and accepts its duty under The Health & Safety at Work Etc. Act 1974 and its associated regulations, The Workplace Health, Safety and Welfare Regulations 1992 as amended 2022 and in particular; The Construction D(Design and Management) Regulations 2015 for ensuring so far as is reasonably Practicable, to the health, safety and welfare of all its employees whilst at work and for the health & safety of any person affected by its activities, acts or services. AMP will comply with current health and safety legislation, codes of practice and other authoritative guidance such as HSE Guidance INDG293(rec1) and HSE Provision of welfare facilities at transient construction sites (sheet No46)

AMP will so far as is reasonably practicable we will (as a minimum) provide adequate toilet and washing facilities. Adequate means we will provide.

1. Enough toilets and washbasins for those who expect to use them – People should not have to queue for long periods to go to the toilet.
2. Where possible, separate male and female toilets – failing that, rooms with lockable doors.
3. Clean facilities – to help achieve this the walls and floors should be covered in suitable waterproof materials to make them easier to clean.
4. A supply of toilet paper and for females, a means of disposing sanitary dressings.
5. Facilities must be well lit and ventilated.
6. Facilities must have a means of hot and cold running water.
7. Enough soap or other washing agents.
8. A basin large enough to wash hands and forearms if necessary.
9. A means of drying hands, e.g. paper towels or hot air dryer.
10. Drinking water will be supplied that is free from contamination and is preferably from the public water supply.
11. A suitable seating area for workers to use during breaks that is clean and has a means of heating food and water.
12. An effective system to manage the facilities such as a check list which is ultimately the site operative in charge of the AMP works, has the responsibility to check.
13. This will include checking that the facilities remain clean and hygienic, there is always enough supply of toilet paper, soap etc. and that the amount of facilities is/remains enough to service the amount of operatives on site.
14. When welfare is required on a site it must be taken into account that each site is unique and will require an assessment of the required facilities. Before a job begins the contracts manager responsible will carry out the assessment and organize the facilities needed and record this in the DPP/Method statement.

All systems of welfare legislation and regulations shall be reviewed at least on an annual basis including this policy statement.
